

Celebrating Epiphany

In the US, Epiphany, or Three King's Day, is always celebrated on the Sunday following New Year's Day: this year January 7th. This day recalls the visit of the Kings or Magi who brought their gifts to the Christ Child.

There are many ways to celebrate this Holy Day: If you haven't taken down your Christmas decorations yet, leave them up a few more days. Have a sweet treat or special dinner. Still have some Christmas money or gift cards? Use one to treat yourself and celebrate. Epiphany is also the traditional day to bless your doorway or home. This might mean writing above the door in chalk: 20+C+M+B+24 (the year and the initials of the Magi), sprinkling holy water on the door or around the house, or just saying a simple prayer: Lord God of heaven and earth, you have revealed your only-begotten Son to every nation by the guidance of a star. Bless this house and all who inhabit it. Fill us with the light of Christ, that our concern for others may reflect your love. We ask this through Christ our Lord. Amen.

Circle of Grace

Teachers will present these lessons, which are required of all RE programs and Catholic schools in the Archdiocese, in class January 24th/28th. This program helps children to understand their own (and others) dignity in mind, body, and spirit. Its ageappropriate lessons include things such as good/bad relationships, safe/unsafe situations, boundaries, etc. Please look over the following information and call the RE office with any questions.
