## REFLECT AND RESPOND 24th Sunday in Ordinary Time

#### FIRST READING (IS 50:4C-9A)

Isaiah stands firm in his faith as he suffered in following God's call. Can you think of a time when you supported someone in their faith?

#### SECOND READING (JAS 2:14-18)

James believed that good works are the fruit of faith. Where is there a need for good works from you this week among family or friends?

#### GOSPEL (MK 8:27-35)

Jesus reveals to His disciples that as the Messiah, He is destined to suffer greatly and die, but on the third day, rise from the dead. This was difficult for Peter to accept. How do you stay open to ideas you resist?

#### GOSPEL MEDITATION



This morning, I received a text message that a member of my extended family will likely die of cancer within the next few hours. His name is Luke. He is a 45-year-old husband and father of six. Though I am not as close to him as my sister (she is his sister-in-law and knows him well), I wonder: how can we, including Luke himself, manage such a terribly awful and unfair situation?

The words of this Sunday's Gospel offer a powerful and challenging path. Jesus says, "If any want to become my followers, let them deny themselves and take up their cross and follow me" (Mark 8:34). Today I see with new

freshness the starkness and strangeness of the words take up. The cross stands for suffering which is unjust, absurd, seemingly hopeless, and humiliating. Jesus doesn't say "accept" or "endure" or "tolerate," but "take up." Embrace it, actively. Choose it and lift it up for others to see what terrifies and sickens us. But somehow, for Jesus, this is the path to "saving one's life." A new world is breaking in, one in which love is everything, when no relationship can be wounded or die. I trust that in the embraced suffering of Luke and his loved ones, Jesus is taking up His cross and saving us all.

By the time you read this, barring a miracle, Luke will have died. He will be carrying his cross no longer. But we all still face suffering. This week let's not just endure, but take up our crosses, big and small. That's our only hope for saving our lives.

### CATHOLIC LIFE EXPLAINED

#### QUESTION:

What is holy water and how do I explain the reason that it is placed at the entrances of churches to my non-Catholic friends?

#### ANSWER:

Holy water is a sacramental, a reminder of the life of the Church expressed and celebrated through the sacraments. God's grace is mediated through word and gesture (the outward signs). This comes to us through Jesus (instituted by Christ) as He entrusts to the Church His saving mission (to give grace). In turn the Church, through the sacraments, shares that grace and mission with us



On Ash Wednesday, we receive ashes on our foreheads to remind us of our origins, humbly created from the dust. But by blessing ourselves with holy water, we are reminded of our destiny! We are baptized sons and daughters of God. This is also a call to conversion, to live more fully our baptismal call to live as disciples of Jesus. We see holy water whenever we renew our baptismal promises. This will occur during the Easter liturgy as well, reminding us that we are indeed on a journey of faith and renewed in Christ. Blessing ourselves with holy water reminds us that we are baptized into a community faith, and always in need of turning from sin and toward God. Holy water is a visible sign of our baptism.

"Let us love the Cross and let us remember that we are not alone in carrying it. God is helping us. And in God who is comforting us, as St. Paul says, we can do anything."

## SAINT CORNELIUS Pope and Martyr



Pope St. Cornelius (d. 253 A.D.) was a Roman citizen and a holy priest who became the twenty-first successor to the chair of St. Peter, following a fourteen-month vacancy when Pope St. Fabian was martyred by Roman Emperor Decius. When the Emperor temporarily left Rome, the persecution against the Christians subsided long enough for the Church to elect St. Cornelius as the new Roman Pontiff. During Pope St. Cornelius' two year reign a great controversy arose as to what to do with Catholics who apostatized from the Christian faith under

threat of death during the persecution. Many were being received back to the sacraments without any penance. In response to the scandal, some maintained that apostates could not be forgiven and could only be admitted back to the sacraments if they were rebaptized. Chief among them was a priest named Novatian, who, as a result of the scandal, caused a schism when he had himself consecrated as an anti-pope. In response, Pope St. Cornelius convened a synod of bishops to confirm his rightful authority as Pope. Novatian was excommunicated and his doctrine was condemned as heresy. Pope St. Cornelius proclaimed that the Church had the power and authority to forgive repentant apostasy, and that converted apostates could be readmitted to the sacraments after true contrition with adequate penance. Soon a new wave of persecution against the Christians broke out, and Pope St. Cornelius was driven into exile and martyred. His feast day is celebrated on September 16.


# Our Lady of Sorrows Title of Mary

Devotion to Our Lady of Sorrows (Mater Dolorosa—Mother of Sorrows) became widespread in the Church around the 14th century. It was revealed to St. Bridget of Sweden (1303-1373) that devotion to Our Lady's Seven Sorrows would bring great graces. Mary, in a unique way, willingly suffered alongside her Divine Son as He gave His life to save the world, and she felt the bitterness of His passion as only a mother can. This devotion is especially remembered during September, the Month of Our Lady of Sorrows, and during the



season of Lent. The Seven Sorrows of Mary are the Prophecy of Simeon, the Flight into Egypt, the Loss of Jesus for Three Days, the Carrying of the Cross, the Crucifixion of Jesus, Jesus Being Taken Down from the Cross, and Jesus Laid in the Tomb. The feast of Our Lady of Sorrows (Mater Dolorosa) is September 15.

# SAINT MARY JOSEPH ROSSELLO Religious



St. Mary Joseph Rossello (May 27, 1811—December 7, 1880) whose given name was Benedetta, was one of nine children, born to a poor family in the seaport of Albisola Marina, Liguria, Italy. At a young age she was sent to live with and work for a childless couple. She stayed in their service for seven years, but even during this time her calling was strong, and she entered the third order of Franciscans at the age of 16. However, she longed to dedicate her life to God in a community of sisters. The religious orders of the time were accustomed to receiving dowries when young women sought entrance, but her poor

family had nothing to give. Although the couple in whose service she worked could have supplied the dowry, they selfishly wanted to keep her for themselves, and so she was denied entry. The Lord provided for St. Mary Joseph in the form of the bishop of Savona who recognized in her a unique ability to teach. She and three other young women were given a house, with some rooms made into classrooms and in 1837 they began the Institute of the Daughters of Our Lady of Mercy, teaching the young and caring for the sick. Benedetta took the name Mary Joseph when she professed her vows in 1840. She was appointed Superior General of the order and led the community as mother superior for 40 years. A dowry was never required to enter the order. In 1875 the order opened their first house in the Americas in Buenos Aires, Argentina and continued to grow to more than three thousand sisters in two hundred houses spread across the world. St. Mary Jospeh was beatified in 1938, and canonized Pope Pius XII in 1949.




