

## REFLECT AND RESPOND 23rd Sunday in Ordinary Time

### FIRST READING (IS 35:4-7A)

The prophet Isaiah encouraged the Israelites to be strong in their conviction that God was coming to heal them and renew creation itself. Who could you encourage to be firm in their faith this week?

### SECOND READING (JAS 2:1-5)

James taught believers to make no distinctions between the rich and the poor in their community gatherings. How do you think showing no partiality helps a community grow in faith?

#### GOSPEL (MK 7:31-37)

We hear today how the people of the Decapolis were astonished at Jesus's healing of the deaf and mute. What parts of your life need healing?

## GOSPEL MEDITATION



One of the most touching YouTube videos I've ever seen is one in which a deaf woman receives new technology to heal her hearing. She hears her husband's voice for the first time—and her own, too—and bursts into tears of overwhelming joy. It must have been like an immovable wall between her and her loved ones came tumbling

We are all like this woman, to some degree. We believe in the presence of God's love, but we can't hear Him. We can't speak well about Him. The deaf man who can't speak properly in the Gospel today is an image of what God

wants us to experience again and again. Jesus takes the man aside to a private place away from the crowd, touches his ears and tongue, and says, "Ephphata!" The man's ears are opened, and he speaks clearly. Contact with Christ has this effect on us.

This experience happens to us in our baptism, almost exactly. It happens to us in the liturgy. It happens in our private prayer. It happens when we hear the voice of God in our conscience. The more we engage these privileged channels of Jesus' healing, the more we are empowered to hear and speak of the presence of God's perfect love.


## CATHOLIC LIFE EXPLAINED

### QUESTION:

What is the history behind feast of the Exaltation of the Holy Cross?

#### ANSWER:

Emperor Constantine's mother, Helena, is credited with having discovered the true cross around 330. She traveled to the Holy Land and uncovered the places associated with Jesus' life. Legend has it that Helena uncovered three crosses but was not able to



detect the true cross until each of them was laid on a leper. Only one of them cured the leper, proving it to be the true cross. A great church was built at the site, and soon various portions of the cross were sent to other churches as relics to be venerated.

The day after the dedication of the Church of the Holy Sepulchre, September 14, 335, the actual cross was displayed for veneration. Egeria, a women traveler to Jerusalem around the year 386, kept a diary that has survived. She tells of the unique veneration of the wood of the cross that took place on Good Friday, something maintained ritually to this very day.

The Exaltation of the Holy Cross focuses on the gift of love that Jesus manifested by His total gift of self, offered for all. The cross, the ultimate form of capital punishment in its day, has become for us the ultimate symbol of love and triumph over evil and death.



Dear God, what a grace to live in a world of all ages and stages. Bless our grandparents, today and always. Thank you for their experiences, wisdom, and insight. Thank you for the gifts they bring the Church. Thank you for the lessons they teach the next generations. Amen.

## SAINT KIERAN THE YOUNGER Bishop




St. Kieran the Younger (512-546 A.D.), also known as St. Ciaran, was born in Connacht, Ireland, the son of a carpenter. He demonstrated a great aptitude in his studies, being educated by a holy deacon who had him baptized. Kieran tended cattle in the fields before continuing his education at Saint Finnian's monastery school at Clonard, where he became a monk. He soon earned the reputation for being the most learned monk at Clonard, and was held in high esteem by his instructors and

peers. Kieran's years of residence there were marked by many miracles. He also mentored, befriended, and tutored many of the founders of the Catholic Church in Ireland. Saint Kieran eventually left Clonard and went on to found the famous Clonmacnoise Abbey in West Meath Ireland, which attracted thousands of students from all over Europe. St. Kieran was one of the Twelve Apostles of Ireland—the first twelve bishops in Ireland consecrated by St. Patrick. He is also honored as the first Irish-born saint. St. Kieran's feast day is September 9.

# SAINT AMBROSE EDWARD BARLOW Priest and Martyr

St. Ambrose Edward Barlow (1585-1641) was born near Manchester, England, to a noble family. He was baptized Catholic at his birth, but was raised Protestant when Catholicism was outlawed by the reigning monarchy. His grandfather died while imprisoned for his Catholic faith, and his father had two-thirds of his estate confiscated for refusal to conform to the Church of England. Ambrose returned to Catholicism as an adult, recognized his vocation to the priesthood, and traveled to France



to enter seminary. He was ordained in 1617 in the Order of St. Benedict. He returned to England to minister to underground Catholics in his native south Lancashire for 24 years, being financially supported with a pension arranged by his grandmother. Ambrose said Mass daily and administered the sacraments secretly to avoid detection by the authorities. He was arrested four times during his priesthood, each time being released without charge. When the king issued a decree that all Catholic priests should immediately flee the country or be arrested and condemned as traitors, St. Ambrose chose to stay, reasoning that he could not die a better death than to be martyred for being a Catholic priest. On April 25, 1631, just as he ended Easter Sunday Mass at Morley Hall near Manchester, he was arrested by a 400-strong armed mob led by the local Anglican vicar. He freely admitted to the charge of being a Catholic priest, and gave a defense of the true faith before his judge. He was sentenced to be hanged, drawn, quartered, and boiled in oil on September 10, 1641. His dead body was publicly displayed on a pike as a warning to other Catholic priests. St. Ambrose Edward Barlow is one of the Forty Martyrs of England and Wales. His feast day is September 10.

# SAINT CATERINA VOLPICELLI Religious



St. Caterina Volpicelli (1839-1894) was born into an upper middleclass Neapolitan family. She was well educated at the Royal Educational Institute of St. Marcellino. She was a typical young woman of her class with a vibrant social life, however, she experienced a conversion through conversations with many holy people. One of these, Blessed Father Ludovico da Casoria, urged her to enter the Third Order of the Franciscans, which she did, remaining in society and evangelizing. On May 28, 1859, Caterina left the lay order and entered the Congregation of Perpetual

Adorers of the Blessed Sacrament. But her stay was short, she was forced to leave because of a severe illness. Caterina was deeply saddened that she had been unable to complete her vocation. But this was the Lord's design, for it was during this time that she learned of a movement in French Jesuit monasteries called the Apostleship of Prayer. This powerful apostleship dedicates each day to the Sacred Heart of Jesus, finding God in every moment, every task. This prayerful way of life and her devotion to the Eucharist, with hours spent in adoration, marked the next stage of her life. Finally, Caterina founded her own order, the Servants of the Sacred Heart on July 1, 1874. Her order opened the orphanage of the Margherites, a lending library, and set up the Association of the Daughters of Mary. The sisters even nursed the many victims of cholera in 1884. St. Caterina participated in the first National Eucharistic Congress celebrated in Naples in 1891. She was canonized on April 26, 2009, by Pope Benedict XVI. Her story of conversion and perseverance marked by a prayerful dedication to the Sacred Heart is an inspiration.







# NINE POWERFUL QUOTES FROM SAINTS On the Holy Eucharist

Over 50,000 people gathered for the National Eucharistic Congress from July 17-21. According to Catholic News Agency, "U.S. bishops launched the multi-year National Eucharistic Revival in 2022 in response to concern about waning belief in the Real Presence of Christ in the Eucharist among American Catholics. The goal of the revival has been to 'renew the Church by enkindling a living relationship with the Lord Jesus Christ in the holy Eucharist." Holy devotion to Christ in the Blessed Sacrament is a common thread in the lives of the saints. We can look to their example and grow in our own relationship with Christ through the Body and Blood of



our Lord. Here are nine quotes from the saints on the Holy Eucharist:

- "A thousand years of enjoying human glory is not worth even an hour spent sweetly communing with Jesus in the Blessed Sacrament." —St. Padre Pio
- 2. "How many of you say: I should like to see His face, His garments, His shoes. You do see Him, you touch Him, you eat Him. He gives Himself to you, not only that you may see Him, but also to be your food and nourishment." —St. John Chrysostom
- 3. "God dwells in our midst, in the Blessed Sacrament of the altar." —St. Maximilian Kolbe
- 4. "Jesus has made Himself the Bread of Life to give us life. Night and day, He is there. If you really want to grow in love, come back to the Eucharist, come back to that Adoration." —St. Teresa of Calcutta
- 5. "The courage and strength that are in me are not of me, but of Him who lives in me—it is the Eucharist."—St. Faustina
- 6. "One of the most admirable effects of Holy Communion is to preserve the soul from sin, and to help those who fall through weakness to rise again. #### SPECIAL EVENTS HERE AT ST. PATRICK

St. Patrick will host the Eucharistic Rosary Congress beginning with an outdoor procession carrying a statue of Our Blessed Mother around several city blocks. We will begin lining up at 4:15 PM on Saturday, October 5 in the Church parking lot. Following the procession, all are invited to attend the 5 PM Mass.

For seven days and seven nights the faithful can come together for Perpetual Adoration of the Blessed Sacrament with the Rosary prayed aloud at the start of each hour, followed by silent prayer for the remainder of the hour.
