

REFLECT AND RESPOND The Most Holy Trinity

FIRST READING (PRV 8:22-31)

Proverbs teaches us that the wisdom of God was present with God throughout creation, playing on earth and finding delight in humans. What brings delight to your life?

SECOND READING (ROM 5:1-5)

Paul encouraged believers that in Jesus we have peace with God and through the Holy Spirit we have the love of God in our hearts. Why do you think these fruits of the Holy Trinity have been given to us?

GOSPEL (JN 16:12-15)

Jesus taught His disciples that the Spirit gives to believers everything the Father has given to the Son. When have you been generous to others?

GOSPEL MEDITATION



I am amazed at how my four siblings teach their many kids in age-appropriate ways. For example, now that my nephew Brandon is 24 years of age, they give him insights and freedoms that would have been positively confounding or even dangerous when he was a toddler. Imagine if they had taught him at age four how to drive a car, use a credit card online, or handle power tools. But eventually, they did, and he is a high functioning young man, I'm proud to say. They are good teachers.

This week we learn that Jesus teaches us in a similar way. He says to His Apostles, "I have much more to tell you, but

you cannot bear it now" (John 16:12). How disappointing for them. But imagine at that moment, before His Resurrection and Ascension, if the Lord had started telling them about synods and sacraments, popes and parishes, martyrs and monasteries, rosaries and relics, catechisms and crucifixes? They would have been absolutely overwhelmed, confused, and discouraged. He tells them what they need to know, when it is time for them to know it.

So, He does for us. Jesus has unceasingly taught the Church as she matures through the centuries, just as He teaches you and me through our lives in ways we can understand. Our task should be to learn what He is teaching us now, knowing that (although revelation per se is complete in Him and His Apostles), He never ceases to teach us as we spiritually mature. Be confident: He knows what you are ready to learn now.

CATHOLIC LIFE EXPLAINED

OUESTION:

I've seen people hang rosaries over the rear-view mirrors in their cars and a few of them wear them around their necks. Is it ok to do that?

ANSWER:

The practice of hanging a rosary or a religious medal off of the rearview mirror of one's car is a fairly popular custom across many cultures. While there is no particular rule approving or condemning this practice, we should also be mindful of the respect and reverence due to religious objects and devotional items (i.e. sacramentals).

An important point to consider would be the reason why one chooses to place a rosary or religious medal in our cars. Is it a reminder of the protection and intercession of Mary and the saints? Does it encourage us to be mindful of God's presence, even in such a mundane task as driving? Is it an outward expression of our more private devotions?




One advantage of having a rosary or religious medal in our cars is that it can also serve as a reminder to pray when we travel, asking for protection for ourselves and for other motorists or commuters. Certainly, invoking the protection and prayers of the saints is a wonderful practice for families, helping to reinforce our belief in the communion of saints and the care and concern we owe to one another.

SAINTS MARK AND MARCELLIAN Martyrs



Sts. Mark and Marcellian (d. 286 A.D.) were twin brothers who were martyred for their faith in Rome under Emperor Diocletian. According to legend they were both deacons from a distinguished family who were thrown into prison for being Christians. Their mother and father, who were pagans, visited their sons in prison and pleaded with them to return to the worship of false gods so that they could be saved. At the same time, St. Sebastian also visited the brothers and encouraged them to stand strong in their faith. St. Sebastian's

exhortation was so persuasive that the parents of Marcellian and Mark were converted, along with several friends who were present, as well as the other prisoners. All of these new Christian converts were eventually martyred alongside Mark and Marcellian. The brothers had their feet nailed to a wood post, and later their bodies were pierced with lances. Their feast day is June 18.

BLESSEDS JOHN FENWICK AND JOHN GAVAN Priests and Martyrs

Bl. John Fenwick and Bl. John Gavan (d. 1679) were Englishmen and Jesuit priests who were martyred for their faith in England during the monarchy's persecution of the Catholic Church. John Fenwick's Protestant parents disowned him when he became a Catholic. The two priests, along with three other Jesuits, were falsely accused of involvement in the "Popish Plot," a fabricated conspiracy that mounted to anti-Catholic hysteria in England over the course of three years. The men were charged with complicity to assassinate King



Charles II and condemned on the charges of High Treason and subversion of the nation's Protestant religion. During their trial, John Gavan acted as the principal spokesman for the group; one historian called him one of the ablest priests of his generation. Both priests were condemned to be hung, drawn, and quartered. It is said that the King, knowing they were innocent yet unwilling to grant them pardon, permitted them to be hanged only. After giving a rousing speech declaring their innocence, Bl. John Fenwick and Bl. John Gavan were martyred together on June 20, 1679. They share a feast day on June 20.

Saint Aloysius Gonzaga

Priest



St. Aloysius Gonzaga (1568–1591) was born to a noble Italian family, the eldest of seven children, and was destined for the military. However, by the time he was nine years of age he chose the religious life and made a personal vow of chastity. As a safeguard against sexual temptation he always kept his eyes downcast in the presence of women. Although many tried to dissuade him from his chosen Vocation, he was eventually allowed to renounce his inheritance and enter the seminary in order to become a Jesuit priest. While he was

studying in Rome, there was an outbreak of the plague. Aloysius volunteered to care for the sick, despite the delicateness of his own health. As a result, he contracted the disease and died at the age of twenty-three, before completing his priestly studies. St. Aloysius was connected with two great figures of the Counter-Reformation: he received his First Holy Communion at the age of twelve from St. Charles Borromeo, and his Last Rites from St. Robert Bellarmine, both of whom served as his spiritual advisers. On the night of his death, St. Mary Magdalene de Pazzi had a vision of him being received into great glory. St. Aloysius Gonzaga is the patron saint of youth and bodily purity. His feast day is June 21.

Help us to be one, Lord Jesus, as you prayed to the Father. Gather us all to you, diverse in culture, gift, call, way of life, and perspective. May the love we have for you overflow into the love we have for each other. Amen.



WHAT ARE THE 12 PROMISES OF THE SACRED HEART Let's Remind Ourselves of these Beautiful Graces

You've probably read them before, but—during this month of the Sacred Heart—let's review the magnificent promises of our Lord to those devoted to His Heart! Revealed to St. Margaret Mary Alacoque in the 17th century, these promises show us in no uncertain terms just how much our Lord desires that we devote ourselves to His loving Heart. For those who do, He promised:

- I will give them all the graces necessary in their state of life.
- 2. I will establish peace in their homes.
- 3. I will comfort them in all their afflictions.
- 4. I will be their secure refuge during life, and above all, in
- 5. I will bestow abundant blessings upon all their undertakings.
- 6. Sinners will find in my Heart the source and infinite ocean of mercy.
- 7. Lukewarm souls shall become fervent.
- 8. Fervent souls shall quickly mount to high perfection.
- 9. I will bless every place in which an image of my Heart is exposed and honored.
- 10. I will give to priests the gift of touching the most hardened hearts.
- 11. Those who shall promote this devotion shall have their names written in my Heart.
- 12. I promise you in the excessive mercy of my Heart that my all-powerful love will grant to all those who receive Holy Communion on the First Fridays in nine consecutive months the grace of final perseverance; they shall not die in my disgrace, nor without receiving their sacraments. My divine Heart shall be their safe refuge in this last moment.

The twelfth promise refers to the First Friday devotion—a very easy way to insert devotion to the Sacred Heart into our monthly routines. All we have to do is receive Holy Communion on nine consecutive First Fridays (ensuring we go to Confession beforehand if we are not in a state of grace), offering these Communions in reparation for the sins committed against the Sacred Heart.

There are many other additional, daily ways to place ourselves in the Heart of Christ. A simple thought of love and affection means so much to Him. "Jesus, I trust in You!" or "Sacred Heart of Jesus, have mercy on us!" are other little prayers we can offer to more firmly bind ourselves to this Heart that loves us so much.


students of St. Mary's Primary School. This year we will be raising funds to support the students of the school—particularly in paying for uniforms for



SACRED HEART NOVENA FOR POPE LEO XIV Prayer Runs June 19-27

The Knights of Columbus are inviting Catholics around the world to pray a Sacred Heart novena for Pope Leo XIV this month. The devotion will run June 19-27, bridging the



anniversary of the Pope's priestly ordination with the Church's celebration of the Solemnity of the Sacred Heart. The Knights are inviting all to participate by pledging prayers and submitting personal intentions through their website. Supreme Knight Patrick Kelly will carry those intentions to Rome in October as part of a Jubilee pilgrimage, according to a press release from the organization. The timing also coincides with the 350th anniversary of the final revelation received by St. Margaret Mary Alacoque, whose visions of Christ's love helped ignite widespread devotion to the Sacred Heart. In addition to the novena, participants are encouraged to pray with Pope Leo's prayer intention for June: "That each one of us might find consolation in a personal relationship with Jesus, and from His Heart, learn to have compassion on the world." 

20 THINGS GUARDIAN ANGELS DO FOR US Better Enlist the Aid of Your Guardian Angel

Imagine you had a bodyguard who was always with you. He did all the usual bodyguard things like protecting you from danger, warding off assailants, and generally keeping you safe in all situations. But he also did more than this: he offered you moral guidance, helped you become a stronger person, and led you to your ultimate calling in life. We don't have to imagine it. We already have such a bodyguard. Christian tradition calls them



guardian angels. Their existence is supported by Scripture and both Catholics and Protestants believe in them. Too often we neglect to utilize this great spiritual resource. (I, for one, am certainly guilty of this!) In order to better enlist the aid of our guardian angels, it might help to have a better appreciation of what they can do for us. Here are 20 things:

- Ward off demons—Sometimes we visualize moral decision-making as a debate between a bad angel whispering in one ear and a good angel speaking wisely in the other. There is a truth to this; according to St. Thomas Aquinas, one of the roles of the guardian angels is to fight off demons (Summa Theologica, Part 1, Question 113, Articles 2-6).
- Protect us from harm—Guardian angels generally protect us from both spiritual and
 physical harm, according to Aquinas (Question 113, Article 5, Reply 3). This belief is
 rooted in Scripture. For example, Psalm 91:11-12 declares, "For He commands His
 angels with regard to you, to guard you wherever you go. With their hands they shall
 support you, lest you strike your foot against a stone."
- 3. **Strengthen us against temptation**—Guardian angels do not just ward off evil, they also strengthen us so we can do it ourselves. As St. Bernard says in a sermon, "As often, therefore, as a most serious temptation is perceived to weigh upon you and an excessive trial is threatening, call to your guard, your leader, your helper in your needs, in your tribulation; cry to him and say: 'Lord, save us; we perish!'"
- 4. Embolden us—St. Bernard also says that with angels such as these at our side we should have no fear. We should have the courage to live out our faith boldly and confront whatever life might throw our way. As he puts it, "Why should we fear under such guardians? Those who keep us in all our ways can neither be overcome nor be deceived, much less deceive. They are faithful; they are prudent; they are powerful; why do we tremble?"
- 5. Intervene miraculously to save us from trouble—Guardian angels not only "guard," they also can save us when we are already in trouble. This is illustrated by the story of Peter in Acts 12, when an angel helps break the apostle out of prison. The story suggests that it is his own personal angel that has intervened (see verse 15). Of course, we cannot count on such miracles. But it's an added comfort to know that they are possible.
- 6. **Guard us from our beginning**—Church Fathers once debated whether guardian angels were assigned at birth or baptism. St. Jerome argued decisively for the former. His basis was Matthew 18:10, which is a crucially important Scriptural passage that supports the existence of guardian angels. In the verse, Jesus says, "See that you do not despise one of these little ones, for I say to you that their angels in Heaven always look upon the face of my Heavenly Father." According to Aquinas, we receive guardian angels at birth rather than at baptism because their aid is associated with our nature as rational beings, rather than belonging to the order of grace (Question 113, Article 5, Answer). But what about at conception? Aquinas believed the unborn child to be under the protection of the mother's guardian angel until birth (see Q113, A5, Reply to Objection 3), but St. Anselm asserts, "every soul is committed to an angel at the moment when it is united with a body," meaning that humans receive guardian angels at conception rather than at birth.
- 7. **Guard all of us—including unbelievers—**This conclusion follows from the above. Aquinas also makes this clear in explaining that God never leaves any of us, including sinners. As the great dogmatic theologian Ludwig Ott explained, "According to the general teaching of the theologians, however, not only every baptized person, but every human being, including unbelievers, has his own special guardian angel from his birth." Pope Benedict XVI also taught that guardian angels are "ministers of the divine care for every human being." (Thanks to Jimmy Akin for highlighting these sources.)
- 8. Remind us of the dignity of persons—This follows from all that has been said before. It is particularly evident from Matthew 18:10 where Jesus instructs us not to "despise the little ones" because they have angels watching over them. (I'm particularly indebted to Protestant preacher John Piper for pointing this out.) As St. Jerome puts it, "The worth of souls is so great that from birth each one has an angel assigned to him for protection." Piper emphasizes how the presence of guardian angels should lead us to a greater respect for our fellow Christians: "Therefore don't despise this simple, unimpressive disciple of Jesus!

Let his angelic entourage remind you whose son he is."

- 9. **Remind us of God's care for all**—Aquinas explains how the angels operate in accordance with God's providential plan for all men (Question 113, Article 6, Answer). It follows that these angels serve as a reminder of His care for us.
- 10. **Bring our needs to God**—Akin says that guardian angels act as intercessors who bring our requests directly to God based on Jesus' words in Matthew 18:10 about angels beholding the face of God.
- 11. **Bring us closer to God**—It follows from the above that guardian angels also aid in bringing us nearer to God. Even when God seems distant, just remember that the guardian angel assigned to you personally is at the same time beholding God directly, as the *Catholic Encyclopedia* notes.
- 12. **Move us to the good**—Guardian angels also move us to the good. As Aquinas writes: "It is moreover manifest that as regards things to be done human knowledge and affection can vary and fail from good in many ways; and so it was necessary that angels should be deputed for the guardianship of men, in order to regulate them and move them to good." (See Question 113, Article 1, Answer and Article 4, Objection 3) This includes prompting us to perform good works, according to Aquinas.
- 13. **Reinforce God's commands**—According to Aquinas, one of the roles of our angelic guardians is helping us use our reason to pursue virtue. In particular, he says the angels help us in developing prudence by serving as God's "universal instructor," passing on God's precepts (Question 113, Article 1, Reply 2).
- 14. Illuminate the truth—Angels "propose the intelligible truth to men" through sensible things, according to Aquinas (Question 111, Article 1, Answer). Although he does not elaborate on this point, this is a basic teaching of the Church that the material world points to invisible spiritual realities. As St. Paul says in Romans 1:20, "Ever since the creation of the world, His invisible attributes of eternal power and divinity have been able to be understood and perceived in what He has made."
- 15. **Strengthen our minds**—A second way that angels enlighten us, Aquinas says, is by reinforcing our intellects. As he puts it, "the human intellect as the inferior, is strengthened by the action of the angelic intellect" (Question 111, Article 1).
- 16. Communicate through our imagination—In addition to working through our senses and intellects, our guardian angels also influence us through our imaginations, according to Aquinas, who gives the example of Joseph's dreams (Question 111, Article 3, On the Contrary and Answer). But it might not be something as obvious as a dream; it could also be through more subtle means like a "phantasm," which could be defined as an image brought to the senses or the imagination (Question 111: Article 1, Answer; definition adapted from the Dictionary of Scholastic Philosophy by Bernard Wueller, SJ).
- 17. Influence our wills—Angels cannot directly move the will, but, according to Aquinas, they can indirectly influence it through our senses and intellect, as stated above (Question 111, Article 2, Answer). This means that our guardian angels influence every part of our being for the better—our senses, intellect, and will.
- 18. Aid in our salvation—The ultimate goal of all that guardian angels do is to aid in our salvation, according to Aquinas. "Angels are sent to minister, and that efficaciously indeed, for those who shall receive the inheritance of salvation, if we consider the ultimate effect of their guardianship, which is the realizing of that inheritance," Aquinas writes (Question 113, Article 5, Reply 1). Here he is drawing from Hebrews 1:14, which states, "Are they not all ministering spirits sent to serve, for the sake of those who are to inherit salvation?"
- 19. **Remind us of our ultimate goal**—Inspired by Christ's words in Matthew 18:10, St. Augustine suggests that guardian angels remind us that our ultimate goal is the beatific vision of God: "As, then, they see, so shall we also see; but not yet do we thus see. Wherefore the apostle uses the words cited a little ago, now we see through a glass, darkly; but then face to face. This vision is reserved as the reward of our faith; and of it the Apostle John also says, when He shall appear, we shall be like Him, for we shall see Him as He is (1 John 3:2). By the face of God we are to understand His manifestation, and not a part of the body similar to that which in our bodies we call by that name." (*City of God*, Book 22, Chapter 29)
- 20. Never leave us—Guardian angels assume their duties at our birth and maintain them up to our death. For Aquinas, this is just an extension of the broader truth that we never completely leave God's care, even in sin and doubt: "Now it is evident that neither man, nor anything at all, is entirely withdrawn from the providence of God: for in as far as a thing participates being, so far is it subject to the providence that extends over all being. God indeed is said to forsake man, according to the ordering of His providence, but only in so far as He allows man to suffer some defect of punishment or of fault. In like manner it must be said that the angel guardian never forsakes a man entirely..." (Question 113, Article 6, Answer)


