

#### REFLECT AND RESPOND

### The Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ (Corpus Christi)

#### FIRST READING (GN 14:18-20)

In reaction to the thanksgiving meal of bread and wine, Abram generously gave Melchizedek a tenth of his possessions. What could you give back to God this week out of gratitude?

#### SECOND READING (1 COR 11:23-26)

Paul tells us from the very beginning the early Church celebrated the Eucharistic meal as a remembrance of Jesus' death and as central to our faith. How does the Eucharist strengthen your faith?

#### GOSPEL (LK 9:11B-17)

The miracle of the feeding of the 5,000 underscores Jesus' desire to feed us. What do you find yourself hungry for today?

#### GOSPEL MEDITATION



A Catholic friend of mine occasionally says, "The Eucharist is not a noun. It's a verb." In so saying, he is making the point that the Eucharist isn't simply Jesus' bodily presence given to us in Holy Communion. It also manifests the dynamic pattern by which Christ actively loves and saves us. He teaches us to cooperate with that pattern. This Eucharist actually embodies four verbs: Jesus takes, blesses, breaks, and gives. Let's consider each one.

**He takes:** Do we acknowledge that we are totally in God's hands? Do we receive everything in our lives as a gift, and act responsibly with it?

**He blesses:** Do we actively reflect that Jesus makes us holy in our baptism? Do we embrace our bodies and souls as temples of God, worthy of love, peace, and joy?

**He breaks:** Do we run from failure and disappointment, from getting old or being ignored? Are we too worried about getting hurt or sick? Do we embrace our sufferings with confidence?

**He gives:** Are we willing to make our lives a gift for others? Are we confident that we will always have enough love to give to others, that God will always provide enough for us? Do we rejoice in giving away what we have to others, expecting nothing in return? This is the dynamic life the Eucharist empowers us to live.

#### CATHOLIC LIFE EXPLAINED

#### QUESTION:

I have been going to Mass for years and have always wondered: why do we make the three signs of the cross before the Gospel?

#### ANSWER:

Certainly, many people go to Mass or other devotions, doing and saying things out of habit or reverence and not really understanding the reasons behind some of these things. But everything we do has a meaning or purpose that helps us to worship better, proclaim our beliefs, or focus the attention of the people on something that has a greater importance or significance. A review of the meaning of various gestures and practices can help us have a deeper appreciation for what we do.



There is a little prayer that goes with the three crosses before the Gospel: "May the words of the Holy Gospel be on my mind, on my lips, and in my heart." In standing to hear the Gospel, we acknowledge that Jesus is present, and the words of the Gospel are addressed to us. All of the gestures and special postures we adopt before the Gospel are intended to help us prepare for hearing the Word as well as act on it. The incense, the Alleluia, the deacon or priest, and the special dialogue and announcement that introduces the Gospel help us focus our attention on the Good News we are about to hear. The three signs of the cross show our desire and good intention to hear and live the Gospel.

Glory be to God the Father, God the Son, and God the Holy Spirit, who calls us into communion with Him, a life of grace and mystery, reconciliation, and unity. Amen.

## SAINT JOSEPH CAFASSO




St. Joseph Cafasso (1811–1860) was born in Castelnuovo d'Asti, Italy, to a peasant family. He was born with a physical deformity of the spine, which caused him to grow into a stunted and crippled man. Discerning a call to Holy Orders, he entered the seminary in Turin where he later met another famous saint—John Bosco. Joseph taught John Bosco and encouraged him in his mission to minister to the town's impoverished street youth. Joseph was an excellent professor of moral theology, as well as a famed preacher and confessor. He performed

his duties so well that he became known as the "Priest's Priest." He spent entire days preaching in prisons, offering comfort to the prisoners, hearing their confessions, and even advocating to improve the poor conditions of the prison. For this work he also earned the name, "Priest of the Gallows." St. Joseph Cafasso is the patron saint of prisoners, prisons, and prison chaplains. His feast day is June 23.

## SAINT DOMINIC HENARES Bishop and Martyr

St. Dominic Henares (1764-1838) was born to a poor family in Spain. He joined the Dominican Order and was ordained a priest in 1790. Ten years later he was sent as a missionary to the Far East. He went from Mexico to the Philippines, and finally to North Vietnam. He became Bishop of Phunhay, Vietnam, in 1803. In 1831 the Vietnamese emperor officially prohibited Catholicism and severely persecuted the Church. Whole villages were sent into exile; priests were arrested and subjected to the most terrible



tortures before they were killed. Those who helped capture them were richly rewarded. Bishop Henares was arrested and beheaded in Nam Dinh on June 25, 1838; the soldiers and villagers who participated in his arrest received generous compensation. St. Dominic Henares is one of an estimated 130,000 to 300,000 Catholics martyred for the faith in Vietnam between the 15th and 20th centuries. They were canonized together by Pope St. John Paul II in 1988. St. Dominic Henares' feast day is June 25, and the collective memorial for 117 of the Vietnamese Martyrs is November 24.

## SAINT JOSEMARÍA ESCRIVA Priest



St. Josemaría Escriva (1902-1975) was born in Spain, one of six children of a devout Catholic family. Growing up, he observed his parents faithfully endure painful family trials (the death of three of their young children and devastating financial setbacks) and this had a profound effect on his own faith. As a teenager he discovered his vocation to the priesthood when he saw the path of footprints in the snow left by a barefoot Carmelite friar. He then experienced a radical conversion: he gave up his intended career as an architect and entered

the seminary. He spent most of his life studying and teaching in universities, earning a doctorate in civil law and theology. St. Josemaria Escriva's lasting impact lies in the foundation of Opus Dei ("The Work of God"), an organization of laity and priests dedicated to the universal call of holiness and the belief that ordinary, daily life is an authentic path to sanctity. Today Opus Dei has over 80,000 members worldwide. His famous written work is The Way, a collection of spiritual and pastoral reflections on the Gospels and their application to everyday life. On June 26, 1975, after glancing at an image of Our Lady of Guadalupe in his office in Rome, St. Josemaría died suddenly of cardiac arrest. He was canonized by Pope St. John Paul II. His feast day is June 26.

"True devotion to Our Lady is holy; that is to say, it leads the soul to avoid sin and to imitate the virtues of the Blessed Virgin, particularly her profound humility, her lively faith, her blind obedience, her continual prayer, her universal mortification, her divine purity, her ardent charity, her heroic patience, her angelic sweetness, and her divine wisdom. These are the ten principal virtues of the most holy Virgin."




This week let us pray for **Rachel Johs** (The Sister Adorers of the Royal Heart of Jesus in Naples) from Immaculate Conception in Omaha.

# SISTER WILHELMINA, PRAY FOR US Faith Connection Prayer Group Field Trip



Members of the St. Patrick Church Faith
Connection Prayer group took a field trip on June
11 to visit the Abbey Church of Benedictines of
Mary, Queen of Apostles monastery in Gower,
MO. Those in attendance were Joan Ingram,
Elaine Scheef, Kris Kappius, Nell Votruba, Linda
Harrison, Karen Tighe, Barb Merkel, Sharon
Wuerfele, Tam Hottovy, Colleen Karmazin, Rosie
Stec, and Linda Gardner. They were able to view
the incorrupt body of Sister Wilhelmina.

Sister Wilhelmina is the foundress of Benedictines of Mary, Queen of Apostles. She passed in May 2019, and her body was exhumed in April 2023 to be moved to a more prominent place in the monastery. The sisters were expecting to find only skeleton as Sister Wilhelmina was not embalmed and she was buried in a simple unsealed wooden casket. However, when they opened the casket they found her body incorrupt.





Incorruptibility is not considered to be an indication of sainthood, and as of right now there has not been an initiation for the cause of her canonization as a saint. That's not to say there won't be in the future. Meanwhile, many continue to be inspired by the life of Sister Wilhelmina. May her faith and witness lead others to Christ. 



## SYMBOLISM OF THE PELICAN Corpus Christi



Have you ever seen a depiction of a pelican in the stained glass windows of your church or in an adoration

chapel you've visited? Read on to discover the spiritual meaning of the pelican and how it is related to the Eucharist.

Before the birth of Christ, an ancient legend claimed that during a famine, a mother pelican would pierce her breast with her beak and feed her young with her own blood. An alternate version of the legend claimed that if a mother pelican's young were dying, she would let them drink her blood to bring them back to health.

Early Christians noticed the parallels between the self-sacrificing bird and Christ, who gave His own Blood for our salvation during His Passion—and continues to give us His Body and Blood in the Eucharist. So those early Christians adopted the symbol of the pelican, which has since been used for centuries. References to a pelican are found even in the writings of Dante and Shakespeare. The best-known reference is found in one of the five Eucharistic hymns composed by St. Thomas Aquinas for the Feast of Corpus Christi when it was first instituted.

The verse in *Adoro Te Devote*, or "Godhead Here in Hiding," roughly translated from Latin, says: "Pelican of mercy, Jesus Lord, cleanse me, unclean, by Thy Blood, of which one drop is enough to wash the world of all sin."

Jesuit poet Gerard Manley Hopkins translated the Angelic Doctor's hymn into poetic English, rendering the following translation: "Like what tender tales tell of the Pelican, Bathe me, Jesus Lord, in what Thy Bosom ran, Blood that but one drop of has the pow'r to win, All the world forgiveness of its world of sin."

## MARY, MOTHER OF PRIESTS Pray for More Holy Priests

The Catholic Church is in need of more holy priests and the perfect intercessor to turn to is Mary, the Mother of Priests. After Jesus' death and resurrection, priests and bishops became the guardians of the faith and were entrusted with the task of feeding the flock of Christ. They were also given the task of preaching the Gospel to the ends of the earth, bringing Jesus' message of love and mercy to as many people



as possible. These are not easy tasks. They require sacrifice, and many young men might hesitate to commit to such a life. This has led to a decrease in men responding to God's call, reducing the number of shepherds working in the Lord's fields.

#### SHE KEEPS WATCH

In times such as these, it is important to turn to the Virgin Mary, as St. John Paul II explained in his apostolic exhortation *Pastores dabo vobis*: "Every aspect of priestly formation can be referred to Mary, the human being who has responded better than any other to God's call. Mary became both the servant and the disciple of the Word to the point of conceiving, in her heart and in her flesh, the Word made man, so as to give Him to mankind. Mary was called to educate the one eternal priest, who became docile and subject to her motherly authority. With her example and intercession the Blessed Virgin keeps vigilant watch over the growth of vocations and priestly life in the Church."

We can turn to her, asking her to protect our current priests but also to inspire other young men to respond to the Lord's invitation. Here is a prayer St. John Paul II composed that invokes Mary under her title of "Mother of Priests."

#### PRAYER TO MARY, MOTHER OF PRIESTS

O Mary, Mother of Jesus Christ and Mother of priests, accept this title which we bestow on you to celebrate your motherhood and to contemplate with you the priesthood of, your Son and of your sons, O holy Mother of God.

O Mother of Christ, to the Messiah—priest you gave a body of flesh through the anointing of the Holy Spirit for the salvation of the poor and the contrite of heart; guard priests in your heart and in the Church, O Mother of the Savior.

O Mother of Faith, you accompanied to the Temple the Son of Man, the fulfillment of the promises given to the fathers; give to the Father for His glory the priests of your Son, O Ark of the Covenant.

O Mother of the Church, in the midst of the disciples in the upper room you prayed to the Spirit for the new people and their shepherds; obtain for the Order of Presbyters a full measure of gifts, O Queen of the Apostles.

O Mother of Jesus Christ, you were with Him at the beginning of His life and mission, you sought the Master among the crowd, you stood beside Him when He was lifted up from the earth consumed as the one eternal sacrifice, and you had John, your son, near at hand; accept from the beginning those who have been called, protect their growth, in their life ministry accompany your sons, O Mother of Priests. Amen.

## BRACE YOURSELF, ORDINARY TIME IS COMING The Cross is Our Bridge to Heaven

I stood in an open field under a blue sky. The sun shone softly on the many wildflowers populating the field, and a light breeze caused the grass to sway rhythmically as if to a song. I delighted in the bright array of colors—white, yellow, orange, green, lavender—that seemed to dance before me in the field. I wandered aimlessly and was forgetful of time. At first, I felt only joy, but gradually I began to feel in my heart as though something was missing. An emptiness which the flowers, the



sun, and the soft breeze could not yet seem to fill. I looked again around the field and I saw in the middle something tall and dark, which I had forgotten was there.

As I approached it, I saw that it was a tree, austere in its leafless limbs. It was not much taller than me but solid with arms outstretched as if for an embrace. As I ran my hands over the wood, I felt strength and firmness in its contours. Then I saw the holes, three wounds forever fixed in that wood. I stood, transfixed by the tree and the weight of its glory. At last, I looked down and saw a mound of gnarled roots, as one sees in trees that have lived long upon the earth. As I followed the roots, I saw that they spread out in every direction and that there was no plant, flower, or tree in that field that was not connected to this tree before me. I knelt down and, placing my hand upon the roots, I felt joy and pain and love and life coursing through me. And then I knew the tree, and I knew that nothing in the field would ever satisfy me without it.

The cross, as this scene imagines, can so easily fade into the background. During Lent, it was so prominent that we could hardly forget it, but during Easter, the festivities, small pleasures, and busyness of spring can cause the cross to slip from our minds. The approach of Ordinary time brings the cross back into view and is a reminder that the Christian life paradoxically holds together the suffering of Lent with the rejoicing of Easter.

The combination of joy and suffering is a paradox exemplified by the wounds that Christ continues to bear even after His Resurrection (see John 20:27). It is a paradox that finds its fullest expression in the cross. Servant of God Luis María Martínez reflects that "there are in the Christian life many virtues and many gifts, many intimate communications with God, and a multitude of holy and heroic acts; but all of them are grouped around the cross, for they are the preparation or the consequence of the intimate, loving sacrifice" (The Sanctifier, 124).

Everything in the Christian life either points to the cross or flows from it. The cross does represent suffering, but it also represents the ultimate act of love, which won our salvation. The cross is the bridge by which we walk to Heaven. From the cross flows joy and life. Not the joy and life that the world offers, but a new joy and new life in Christ. "Whoever loses his life for my sake will find it" (Matt 10:39).

So, as we transition into Ordinary time, look to the cross, which stands as our anchor. Look to the cross upon which we were redeemed by the Savior's Precious Blood. Look to the cross for meaning, for joy, and for life: "See how the cross of the Lord stands revealed as the tree of life."

## The Memorare Prayer



The Memorare is a prayer to the Blessed Mother in which the supplicant calls upon the maternal love and protection of Mary's intercession in an hour of dire need. "I fly unto thee, O Virgin of virgins, my mother," reads one section of the prayer, which goes on to beseech "the Mother of the Word Incarnate" to receive these petitions with love and mercy.

St. Teresa of Calcutta and St. Francis de Sales were two great devotees of this prayer. Popularized in the 17th century by a French priest named Fr. Claude Bernard, the text is derived from an older and longer prayer entitled "Ad sanctitatis tuae"

pedes, dulcissima Virgo Maria" ("at your holy feet, most sweet Virgin Mary"). The title "Memorare" is taken from the Latin word for "remember," which begins the prayer. The modern version appears in the 1846 Raccolta, a collection of indulgenced prayers.


