

REFLECT AND RESPOND All Souls' Day

FIRST READING (WIS 3:1-9)

Our Wisdom writer speaks of just souls resting peacefully in God's loving hands. Can you think of a more peaceful image of death?

SECOND READING (ROM 5:5-11 OR ROM 6:3-9)

Paul teaches the Romans that with Jesus' Resurrection, "death no longer has any power over Him," or us, as believers. Does this belief help you through times of grieving from the loss of a loved one?

GOSPEL (JN 6:37-40)

Jesus taught the crowds that anyone who believes in Him will have eternal life and be raised from the dead on the last day. How do others know you believe in Jesus?

GOSPEL MEDITATION



I lost my wallet this year. It was such an annoyance to replace everything in it. A friend, moved by sympathy, gave me a beautiful new one. One month later I lost that one, too, with all my newly replaced cards. No matter what I did, I couldn't find what I had lost. I resigned myself to never seeing either of my wallets again.

Fortunately, the Lord Jesus is not like me in this regard. In today's Gospel (John 6:37–40), He says, "This is the will of the one who sent me, that I should not lose anything of what He gave me." Jesus, unlike me, is ever vigilant with what the

Father has given Him. He searches for every lost soul—as the shepherd leaves the ninetynine to pursue the one lost sheep, or the woman rejoices upon recovering a lost coin—and even descends to the depths of loss on the cross and into the realm of the dead to recover that which seems forever lost.

On All Souls' Day, as we remember our faithful departed, these words kindle a hope beyond hope in our hearts. Even the dead are not lost to Jesus, though they may seem so to us. Nothing entrusted to Him by the Father is ever truly lost. So, we may hope that every soul, no matter how wandering or forgotten in life, is secure in His loving care and destined to be raised on the last day. Of what the Father gives Him, He loses nothing.

CATHOLIC LIFE EXPLAINED

QUESTION:

What do Catholics believe about the resurrection of the dead?

ANSWER:

Every Sunday, we proclaim in the Creed that we believe "in the resurrection of the body." Does that mean Christ's Resurrection or our own? Both! Jesus' Resurrection is part of the work of salvation, but it's also a sign of what's to come. While death separates our bodies and our souls, this was not the intention of God when He first created us. It's an effect of




original sin. At the end of time, our bodies and our souls will be reunited.

Scientifically, we may have questions about this, since bodies decompose over the course of centuries. Or what about the saints, whose relics are spread around the earth? How the resurrection will happen is a mystery. But we know that our resurrected body will be our body. If we are in Heaven, our body will be in a glorified state. Some theologians speculate what this glorification will be like based on Jesus' resurrected body. Will we be able to walk through walls? Will we eat, since Jesus broke bread with His disciples? We don't really know the answers to these questions. We do know, however, that we will be free from the effects of the fall (such as sickness and pain) and physical defects that occurred in life. Christ redeems us as whole persons, body and soul!

"If we examine closely the rest of our Blessed Lord's life, we shall see that it was His will to begin His miracles by Mary. He sanctified St. John in the womb of his mother, St. Elizabeth, but it was by Mary's word. No sooner had she spoken than John was sanctified; and this was His first miracle of grace. At the marriage of Cana He changed the water into wine, but it was at Mary's humble prayer; and this was His first miracle of nature. He began and continued His miracles by Mary, and He will continue them to the end of ages by Mary." —St. Louis De Montfort, *True Devotion to Mary*, pg. 9

BLESSED JOHN BODEY Martyr



Blessed John Bodey (1549-1583) was born in Wells, England, the son of a wealthy merchant and former mayor. He studied at Oxford and became an Oxford Fellow in 1568 at the age of 19. Later he, along with seven others, was deprived of his fellowship for being a Roman Catholic by the Anglican Bishop of Winchester. Bodey, a married layman and schoolmaster, was arrested in 1580 for continuing to practice the Catholic religion and rejecting England's newly-established heretical

Church of England. He was kept in iron shackles for three years, which he called his "school of patience." In 1583 he was tried for treason, both for being a faithful Roman Catholic and for repudiating King Henry VIII's claim of supremacy of the Church in England over against the Holy Father. Bodey wrote that his iron chains were earning him glory in Heaven, even kissing the chain halter around his neck. He was executed under Queen Elizabeth on November 2, 1583 by being hanged, drawn, and quartered at Andover. He died with the name of Jesus on his lips. His mother rejoiced that her son persevered to the end and won the crown of martyrdom; she gave a feast in honor of him being numbered among the saints in Heaven. John Bodey was beatified in 1929 and is one of the 40 Martyrs of England and Wales. His feast day is November 2.

SAINT CHARLES BORROMEO Bishop

St. Charles Borromeo (1538–1584) was born into an ancient and wealthy family in Lombardy, Italy. When his uncle became Pope Pius IV, Charles was brought to Rome to take over several important assignments connected with the Vatican. He was ordained to Holy Orders at the age of 25 and was later made Archbishop of Milan, a position of high influence in the Church, and Cardinal. He initiated large-scale reform of his enormous and dilapidated diocese, which had not seen a



resident bishop in 80 years. Clergy were ignorant and disobedient, religious were negligent and scandalous, and the laity had drifted from Church teaching. He rectified abuses and maintained the integrity of the Church's internal structure, all for which he encountered strong opposition and threats against his life. He also established hospitals, seminaries, orphanages, and the first Sunday School classes. He was a key player in the Council of Trent and kept it going when it was in danger of breaking up. He was a prominent defender of Church teaching in the Counter-Reformation and helped produce an official catechism. His counsel was widely sought, especially by the Catholic kings and queens of Europe and the popes under whom he served, and his virtue was evident to all. Throughout his life he held his rank and authority with humility, living austerely and constantly striving for sanctity. When plague and famine hit Milan in 1576, Charles stayed in the city to care for those in need and borrowed large sums of money to feed tens of thousands of people each day. Exhausted from his reforming labors, he died at the age of 46. St. Charles Borromeo is the patron of catechists, catechumens, seminarians, spiritual directors, and bishops. His feast day is November 4.

SAINT LEONARD OF NOBLAC Religious



St. Leonard of Noblac (d. 559 A.D.) also known as St. Leonard of Limoges, was a French nobleman in the court of Clovis I, King of France. He was converted to the Christian faith, along with the King, by St. Remigius, Bishop of Rheims. After his conversion he abandoned his worldly pursuits, left the royal court, and followed St. Remigius as a disciple. He obtained special permission from the king to release any prisoners whom he deemed worthy of pardon. He declined an offer of a

bishopric and entered the monastery at Orleans to live a life of prayer and penance. Desiring greater solitude and penance than what the monastery allowed, he withdrew into a forest to live as a hermit. He built a small cell and lived on herbs and fruits. He soon attracted followers who joined him in his ascetic life. In thanksgiving for his prayers that the Queen of France would safely deliver her child, St. Leonard was given a large tract of royal land in Noblac. There the saint built an abbey where he served as abbot until his death. A village grew around the abbey that still exists today, named Saint-Léonard-de-Noblat. Numerous shrines are dedicated to St. Leonard across Europe, and thousands of miracles are credited to his intercession. He is the patron saint of prisoners and women in labor. His feast day is November 6.



HOLY LAND OLIVE ART MISSION—THIS WEEKEND Supporting Fellow Christians in the Holy Land



Holy Land Olive Art Mission is recommended by the Archbishop of Jerusalem. He has written asking for your help on behalf of Christians in the Holy Land. Did you know that Catholics and Christians once made up 63% of the people in the Holy Land? Now they are less than 2% of the whole population. They have been driven from the Holy Land by government policies, curfews, roadblocks, miserable living conditions, and other prejudices against Catholics in the Middle East, those Catholics that remain are finding it increasingly difficult to make a living and provide for their families. They are looking for a more secure life and a steady income on which they can feed their families.

Holy Land Catholics are known worldwide for their olive wood carvings. Generation after generation, families have taught their children to carve religious figures from olive wood by hand. For two centuries Catholics have been able to support their families by selling these unique carvings to pilgrims who visit. Fewer and fewer pilgrims have come now, all due to the bloody military conflicts. The Archbishop of Jerusalem has now blessed the mission of selling hand carved olive items to Catholics worldwide. That is why I am here.

We brought these carvings to the United States as part of this mission. Selling this holy unique art has helped Catholics make a living there. These olive wood carvings are very beautiful. The olive tree is an ancient symbol of peace, wisdom, glory, power, and pureness. The olive tree and olives are mentioned over 30 times in the Bible, in both the Old and New Testaments. Many olive trees are said to be several centuries old. Darker wood from these olive trees is said to be from the time of Christ.

The Archbishop of Jerusalem is asking you to consider buying these items to continue the income for local Christians and Catholics to support their families and their presence in the Holy Land. Commit to Pray for the Holy Souls in Purgatory Daily

Have you ever lost someone you loved? Do you wonder if they have reached Heaven? Or when you should stop praying for them? Prayers for those who have attained Heaven are never wasted, they are applied to other souls in need.

St. Patrick Church is forming a Purgatorial Society, which is an organization for members to pray for the Holy Souls in Purgatory. Purgatory is a state of final purification after death for those who died in God's grace but are still being purified. This society is rooted in Catholic doctrine regarding Purgatory and the Communion of Saints, and it serves to help these souls reach Heaven. Souls in purgatory are unable to pray for themselves so they depend on us to hasten their purification.



The purpose is to pray daily for the Holy Souls using the St. Gertrude Prayer, (only 50 words). A printed and an electronic copy will be provided to each member. Participants will be kept confidential. There are no meetings, no dues, no commitments except to say this prayer daily, on your own time. MASS INTENTIONS


